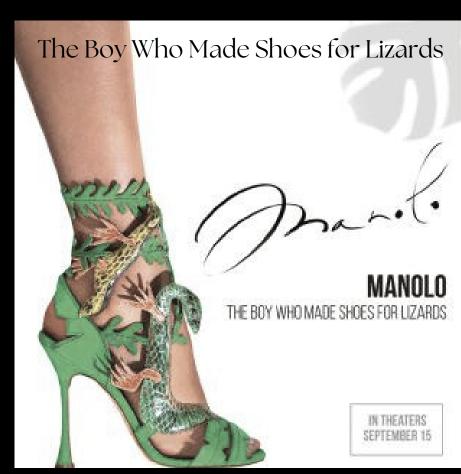

Value change: **from bland, messy and without style** to owning your eclectic and unique **artistic flair**.

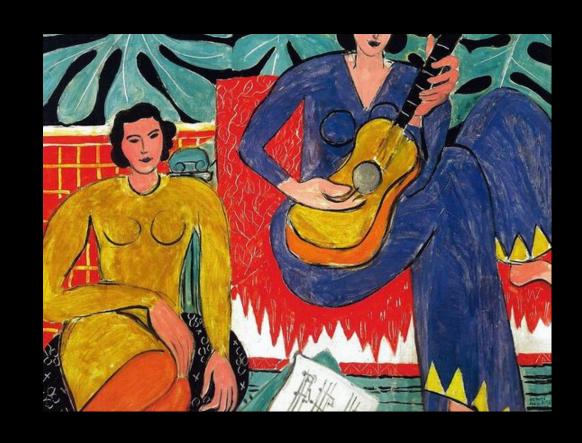

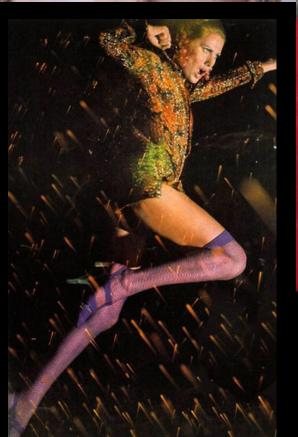
